The Learnington Arts Centre (LAC) is a public, not-for-profit arts centre with a focus on exhibiting visual arts and developing arts and culture programming.

The LAC was established as the South Essex Arts Association in 1971 with the mandate to create, sustain and celebrate the arts. Over the years, the LAC has developed into a cultural pillar for uptown Leamington and a regional arts and culture destination. Supported by the Municipality of Leamington, donors and its members, LAC is a 10,000 square foot facility comprising of four exhibition spaces, a market place artist market, café and wine bar, an art supply store, an education studio and meeting spaces.

The LAC is an award winning organization known for its wide range of activities, and emphasis on community and local programming alongside ancillary events. The LAC presents a changing calendar of up to 40 diverse exhibitions each year and is home to the notable Henry collection and the LAC permanent collection, collectively comprising of over 600 Canadian, international, historical, and contemporary works of art.

Distinguished for offering a wide range of local programming, the LAC is committed to facilitating access and stimulating the appreciation and understanding for visual arts and relevant cultural topics.

Like many organizations, the LAC could not function at its present level without volunteers, and we are thankful to those who choose to donate the hours each week. Of course the events above all require hundreds of volunteer hours to even get off the ground. I personally thank all the members of the board for their support, and our staff Chad Riley and Sharon Suitor who put in the hours to keep the LAC viable.

## Message from the Director/Curator



2022 marked a recovery year from COVID-19, but for the LAC the rebound set a new bar for the organization–catapulting the return of existing programs and allowing opportunities for new. With recovery grants and wage subsidies received, the LAC began the year stable with funds to invest in programs.

An incredible 41% increase in revenue over the previous year defined capabilities and possibilities. Ultimately, the recovery grants provided investment income to the programs and the extra programs delivered additional revenue making a win-win scenario.

This, in addition to continued public support by way of donations, memberships and genuine interest and support of the programs, led to the ultimate success of 2022. The result was a bright and artful year, elevating the LAC out of the pandemic.

#### **Exhibits & Events**

For the first time in two years the exhibition season was complete with little impact of COVID-19 shutdowns. The annual season opener, the 8x10 Amateur Photography Contest had to be held virtually, however that did not impact the response of submissions with 196 in total.

The season delivered 27 exhibition and displays, only slightly under a typically exhibition season and an increase over 2021 which had only realized 12 in-person exhibitions.

Characteristically the annual *Juried Student Art Show* was the largest exhibition of the year, however it realized an unprecedented 435 works by 158 students from 10 Secondary Schools across Essex-County; nearly four times the number of works submitted the previous year. This exhibit continues to thrive due to the sponsorship of the Rotary Club of Leamington and the Kiwanis Club granting \$2,000 in cash prizes to students. Furthermore, the support of the teachers and talent of the students certainly make this exhibition a community favourite.

The 5th annual WFCU Painting Competition + Exhibit also saw an increased response with 100 works from artists, in 12 different cities and towns from across the region. Artists were supported with \$1,300 in prize money by the WFCU Credit Union.

A notable and welcome addition to the exhibition line up was the Z'otz\* Collective based out of Toronto. This exhibition in partnership with Art Windsor-Essex (AWE) featured an indoor mural and many collage and works in series. The group uses humour and play to examine the immigrant experiences of displacement, transition, and transformation. Z'otz\* Collective has shown work at multiple galleries and museums across Canada.

Another significant highlight of the year was the return of two huge events – Arts @ the Marina and the Mill St. Markets. After a 2-year hiatus Arts @ the Marina returned even bigger and better than ever before, with a new event layout, new rates and many other program changes which added to its success. While sponsorship was impacted due to COVID-19, artist participation and visitor turnout certainly was not. For the LAC, the return of the biggest fundraiser of the year also contributed to the overall increase in revenue for the year.

As the LAC had worked in partnership with the Municipality of Leamington in 2019 on the last Mill St. Markets, the event was handed over to the LAC to take the lead on. Two markets were delivered, June and August with Arts @ the Marina in July rounding out the summer season of outdoor events. With the support of the Municipality, the Uptown Leamington BIA and music provided by the Bank Theatre, the Mill St. Markets were just what everyone needed to get out of the COVID slump. Over 5,000 people attended each market with the streets lined and every space full of food vendors, artists and artisans, live music, and serving local craft beers and wine. The event generated extra public attention for the LAC and a new stream of revenue.

Summer 2022, a new community and public art initiative was presented – the *Mural Mosaic*. In partnership with the Mayor Youth Advisory Committee (MYAC), Mayor MacDonald and the Municipality, the project was developed. The completed mural painted by members of the community featured 272 individual image tiles which joined to create on larger image, the *Tree of Life*. The completed mural is located on the Mill St. side of the LAC, approx. 9ft by 9ft as a vibrant addition to the uptown and LAC facility.

## **Grants & Fundraising**

During the public closures, grant research, writing and program development became a significant focus to ensure the sustainability of the LAC. As a result, many grants were obtained, most notably the Tourism Recovery Grant from the Federal Government. This \$100,000 grant enabled the LAC to begin a new strategic plan, begin construction of a new outdoor patio, purchase event equipment and begin development of new experiences for the new outdoor space. Work will continue and be completed in 2023 with even more new announcements in next year's report.

The Municipality of Learnington again was a primary supporter of the LAC, with a community grant, in addition to the use of the facility and a municipal budget for repairs and maintenance. This vital support is at the core of funding for LAC operations, community arts programs and services for residents and tourists.

A grant from the Windsor Endowment for the Arts (WEA) was received along with funding from the Uptown Leamington BIA to produce *Bright Spots* a public arts project in which six works from the collection will display in steel fabricated frames at various locations in the uptown and at the waterfront. The initiative is expected to be installed in the summer 2023.

Additional grants included wage subsidy, a small business grant, a BIA uplift grant, and a Canada summer jobs staffing grant. And fundraisers included 50/50 lotteries and CRAVE Family Grill & Pub fundraising day.

In total \$180,000 in grants were received securing the position of the LAC for 2022.

### **Donors, Members, Volunteers & Supporters**

It is by way of the generous support from donors, members, volunteers, and supporters that the LAC has a thriving purpose. Support by way of individual and corporate membership was incredibly strong in 2022 with \$36,000 in public support.

In 2022, the LAC was pleased to announce the sponsoring and naming by Ms. Susan Ross of the main floor Kitchenette. Ms. Ross is a resident of Learnington and a long-time member and supporter of the Learnington Arts Centre. The donation enabled the remodeling of the kitchenette not only making the dated space fresh and modern, but also to better serve guests at events and venue rentals.

Through the WindsorEssex Community Foundation, the Honey Family Foundation also gifted the LAC with a \$15,000 donation (2021) to support resilience through the pandemic. The funds were used in 2022 to fully renovate the second floor community gallery and meeting space. The new space opened in February with its first exhibit - all new lighting, ceiling and window coverings, making the space much more conducive for exhibitions and meetings.

With the support of our friends a Speedprint, a 25ft banner was installed on the façade of the LAC marking the LAC's 50 years of success. The project completely sponsored by Speedprint will gain much attention to the LAC and promote its success and programs.

The SEAA/LAC volunteer Board of Directors remains at the core of our volunteer base, dedicating not only time and energy, but expertise and skills which help guide and move the organization forward. Long-term members Mike Thibodeau, Jan Batman and Arlene Sinasac offer continuity to our board, while the additional of a new member, Andrea Niven brings new ideas and vision. All board members are a valued and integral component of the LAC.

At the centre of the day-to-day operations and the front desk is our highly dependable, skilled, multi-tasking Programs Coordinator, Sharon Suitor. Over the years Ms. Suitor's roles at the LAC has evolved, not only with the changes from the pandemic, but with the growth of the LAC. With her unwavering aid and dedication to the organization, the LAC has been able to accomplish much. Her abilities have enabled my role as Director/Curator to pivot less from the day-to-day to more of the financial, development and long-term goals of the LAC. Ultimately together as a team supported by the Board and volunteers, artists and the public, the operations of the LAC are more advanced and poised for even greater growth and possibilities.

The LAC also saw the introduction of a permanent third staff for the first time with a Visitors Services and Gallery Attendant. Unfortunately, the position saw much turnover in staffing, however Julia Sanders, who held the position last year for a period of time has returned to the position.

Filing in the gaps, since 2018, Sally LaPla has contributed over 300 hours of regular volunteer service in the areas of docent and administrative assistant. Mrs. LaPla's dedicated volunteerism has considerably aided staff and has been a welcoming presence for visitors. The additional support of many other volunteers as listed in the Annual Report also pointedly contributed to the workforce, making programs and events possible.

## **Education & Learning**

The LAC strives to enrich our community's understanding and appreciation for the arts and culture. The education programs assist to enhance skills and talents by providing a variety of classes and workshops. During COVID-19 group gathering, gallery and museum restrictions made education programs non-existent throughout 2020-21. However, with the addition of a brand-new instructor at the LAC, retired teacher Andrea Niven brought vitality and strength back to the education and learning department.

A wide variety of programs for youth and adults were delivered, from acyclic painting, Sip N' Paint nights, summer camps, mixed media classes, and more. The programs were full and prosperous, bringing back many aspiring artists to the LAC and revenue for the organization. Having Mrs. Niven on board is exactly what the program needed.

## **Facility**

With the support of the Tourism Recovery grant, the new patio began; the community gallery and meeting space was renovated with the support of the WindsorEssex Community Foundation/Honey Family Foundation, the kitchenette remodeled with the support of Susan Ross and our team of volunteers and staff did many minor repairs from painting to rearranging spaces.

New and extra equipment was purchased for the community meeting room, board room, visitor services area, and galleries which enhanced visitor appeal and function of the spaces.

Thanks to the Municipality of Leamington, a much-anticipated new digital outdoor sign was installed. The final steps of the project will be completed making the sign functional in 2023. The new sign will help to identify the LAC from the outside, while promoting programs and activities in a highly visible manner.

### In Summary

2022 marked the highest revenue grossing year the LAC's 50-year history. And while funds are important; as with more funds, more programs can be delivered for the benefit of the community, it is also equality important to note the success of the participatory numbers in the programs and events. Tens of thousands attended the Mill St. Markets and Arts @ the Marina, were involved in the Mural Mosaic Project, exhibiting in exhibitions, visiting the gallery, shopping the Art Supply Shop and Market Place...

The LAC had an extraordinary year marked again with growth, development, strength, and stability which is more than one could ask for coming out of a multi-year pandemic.

It is for these reasons and many more that the LAC was awarded the Chamber of Commerce Business Excellence Award in 2022 and was a finalist for the 6th year in a row for Best Art Gallery in the Tourism Windsor-Essex Pelee Island's Best of Windsor-Essex annual awards.

And it is with thanks to our many valuable donors, sponsors, members and to all supporters that I am proud of the work that has been accomplished and I am pleased to present the 2022 Annual Report.




POINT PELEE: Artist in Residency Exhibit, 2022

The SEAA/LAC's collection is of great pride amongst its staff, members and constituents. We take our mission seriously to enrich culture through the collection and preservation of art. Since its founding in 1971, the SEAA/LAC has acquired hundreds of works of art, collecting in the areas of Canadian and international historical and contemporary art. The collection has been built both through donated gifts and considered purchases. Approximately 90% of Gallery acquisitions come from private donors – often dedicated collectors looking for a permanent home for their works where they will be appreciated, cared for and put on display for others to enjoy. It is because of the generosity of these donors that the SEAA/LAC enjoys the position it holds as a collecting institution.

In January 2021, as the world greeted a new year amid the pandemic, I was fortunate to find a door that opened a new chapter in my life's story. Z'otz\* Collective was formed in Toronto in 2004 by three artists of Latin American heritage: Nahúm Flores, Erik Jerezano, and Ilyana Martínez. In a shared studio, they meet weekly to collaborate on works that incorporate drawing, painting, collage, sculpture, and site-specific installation. Their work connects to the storytelling traditions of their Latin American culture. Through the wording of their titles, the Collective gives hints to the narratives contained within their works, while leaving space for viewers to create their own conclusions. The direct approach of drawing, their primary means of expression, enables them to create quirky subjects and hybrid creatures.

They use humour and play to examine the immigrant experiences of displacement, transition, and transformation. Z'otz\* Collective has shown work at multiple galleries and museums across Canada.



# **Education Report**

My name is Andrea Niven, a retiree after working for 30 years for the Windsor Essex Catholic District School Board as an elementary teacher. During those years, I provided English and French instruction in a wide range of subjects in primary, junior and intermediate divisions. More notably, I instructed the Arts on a rotary system to intermediate students for several years. I have extensive experience working in the arts and now operate Bear Foot Studios, a small art business.



It is my pleasure to offer education programs to the community though the LAC and I am proud to have kicked off my first year with great success.

In July of last year, 2022, two week-long Summer Art Camps were offered, one in July and one in August. The mornings were reserved for youth aged 4 to 8 and the afternoons were open to youth 9 to 14 years old. The programs had an excellent turn-out and the children had a lot of fun.



# **Community Gallery Renovations**

The Learnington Arts Centre (LAC) is proud to announce the sponsoring and naming by the Honey Family Foundation and the WindsorEssex Community Foundation (WECF) of the newly upgraded Community Gallery + Meeting Space at the LAC.

At Municipality of Leamington Outdoor Courtyard in August 2021, the LAC was presented with a gift of \$15,000 from the Honey Family Foundation/WECF. These funds along with an investment of the LAC's own were used to fully renovate the 2nd floor community gallery and meeting space throughout January 2022.

With Honey Family Foundation/WECF funding and the workmanship of Peter Sawatzky and team, the space underwent an extensive transformation. The entire ceiling was removed and replaced; all new energy efficient LED lighting was installed to upgrade older florescent lighting and all new LED track lighting installed to illuminate the artwork on exhibition, which the room previously did not feature. The final touches included a sponsor recognition plaque, repainting and refurnishing of the space.

# **BIA Uplift Beautification Grant**

### What is it?

Learnington property owners or business owners may submit a proposal to the Learnington BIA Board of Directors outlining desired façade improvements. BIA Members are eligible to apply for this grant once a year (as project funding allows).

# Tourism Relief Fund (TRF) Grant

- TRF-supported initiatives are helping tourism businesses and organizations:
- adapt their operations to meet public health requirements
- improve their products and services
- position themselves for post-pandemic economic recovery

The LAC was awarded the TRF Grant in 2022. The grant monies have gone toward a revamped outdoor space which will broaden the programming offered by the LAC. In expanding the usable space through the creation of a patio space, the LAC intends to develop arts and culture-related tourism experience for year-round programming.

The outdoor space will include:



Paul Shaughnessy was born October 20th 1919 in Toronto, Ontario and first became interested in art in England while with the R.C.A.F. He observed and became friendly with Canada's official war-artists and joined them in sketching using dry-brush with India ink.

Back in Canada, Shaughnessy was convinced by his old friend, artist R.D. Wilson, to take up painting buildings of historical and sentimental significance in South Western Ontario. He began painting old schools, churches, hotels, and halls that were intended to be demolished as a way to document the fast-disappearing buildings. His work has found its way into schools, government offices, private homes and now the collection of the LAC.



# **Smart Serve**

To ensure patrons receive safe and quality service, new LAC staff, Sharon Suitor, completed the online Smart Serve course. Chad Riley was already certified.

**The Smart Serve** Responsible Alcohol Beverage Sales & Service Training Program is approved by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) as the only responsible alcohol training program for Ontario. Smart Serve is a dedicated advocate for a safer and healthier Ontario. It is required by law to sell or serve alcohol in Ontario. This program is designed for servers, bartenders, hostesses, food and beverage managers, or anyone who is involved in an event where alcohol is served.

# Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (USPAP) 2021-2022

Chad Riley completed the seven-hour, mandatory USPAP course, required for all ISA appraisers. The Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (USPAP) are the generally recognized ethical and performance standards for the appraisal profession in the United States. USPAP was adopted by Congress in 1989, and contains standards for all types of appraisal services, including real estate, personal property, business and mass appraisal. Compliance is required for state-licensed and state-certified appraisers involved in federally-related real estate transactions. USPAP is updated every two years so that appraisers have the information they need to deliver unbiased and thoughtful opinions of value.

A review of financial statements in accordance with Canadian generally accepted standards for review engagements is a limited assurance engagement. The practitioner performs procedures, primarily consisting of making inquiries of management and others within the entity, as appropriate, and applying analytical procedures, and evaluates the evidence obtained.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less in extent than, and vary in nature from, those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on these financial statements.

### Basis for Qualified Conclusion

In common with many operations, the entity receives cash for its sales, the completeness of which is not susceptible to satisfactory review procedures. Accordingly, we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to revenue, excess of revenues over expenses (expenses over revenues) and assets for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021 and net assets as at January 1 and December 31 for both the 2021 and 2022 years.

### Qualified Conclusion

Based on our review, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Conclusion paragraph, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that these financial statements do not present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of South Essex Arts Association as at December 31, 2022, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

# Notes to Financial Statements for the year ended December 31, 2022

# **Nature of Operations**

South Essex Arts Association is a registered charity. The organization is a public, not-for-profit arts centre with a focus on exhibiting visual arts and developing arts and culture programming.

# 1. Summary of Accounting Policies

The financial statements were prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations (ASNFPO) and include the following accounting policies:

# Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Significant items subject to such estimates and assumptions include the valuation of inventory and accrued liabilities. Although these estimates are based on management's best knowledge of current events and actions that the organization may undertake in the future, actual results could differ from the estimates.

### Inventory

Inventory, which consists of retail merchandise, is valued at the lower of cost and net realizable value, with cost being determined on a first-in, first-out basis. Net realizable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business.

### **Donated Services**

The work of the organization benefits from the voluntary service of many individuals. Where these services are not normally purchased by the organization and because of the difficulty of determining their fair value, most donated services are not recognized in these financial statements. During the year, \$16,209 (2021 - \$9,531) of donated services and \$Nil (2021 - \$29,220) of art are recorded in the financial statements.

#### Revenue Recognition

The organization follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions and grants. Under this method, restricted contributions and grants are deferred and recognized as revenue when the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions and grants are recognized as received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

Donations and sponsorhips are reported as revenue when received. Market place, art supply supply shop exhibits and art sales, rentals, events, educational programs and all other income is recorded at the time of sale or when the service is provided, the price can be estimated or determined, and collection is reasonably assured. Government assistance is recorded when amount can be reasonably determined and criteria for the program have been met. Memberships are recorded based on the period of membership. Other revenue is recorded when received.

#### Financial Instruments

Measurement of Financial Instruments

The organization initially measures its financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value, except for certain non-arm's length transactions.

# Notes to Financial Statements for the year ended December 31, 2022

### 1. Summary of Accounting Policies (Cont'd)

#### Financial Instruments (Cont'd)

Measurement of Financial Instruments (Cont'd)

The organization subsequently measures all its financial assets and financial liabilities at amortized cost, except for investments in equity instruments that are quoted in an active market, which are measured at fair value. Changes in fair value are recognized in net income.

Financial assets measured at amortized cost include cash and government remittances receivable.

Financial assets measured at fair value include investments.

Financial liabilities measured at amortized cost include accounts payable and accrued liabilities, government remittances payable and long term debt.

### Impairment

Financial assets measured at cost are tested for impairment when there are indicators of impairment. At the present time there are no indications of impairment.

### **Transaction Costs**

The organization recognizes its transaction costs in net income in the period incurred. However, the carrying amount of the financial instruments that will not be subsequently measured at fair value is reflected in the transaction costs that are directly attributable to their origination, issuance or assumption.

#### 4. Financial Instruments

### Risks and Concentrations

The organization is exposed to various risks through its financial instruments, without being exposed to concentrations of risk. The following analysis provides a measure of the organization's risk exposure at the balance sheet date.

# Liquidity Risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that an organization will encounter difficulty in meeting obligations associated with financial liabilities. The organization is exposed to this risk mainly in respect of its accounts payable and accrued liabilities and government remittances payable. The organization manages its liquidity risk by constantly monitoring cash flows and financial liability maturities, and by holding assets that can be readily converted into cash. Management believes the organization has sufficient funds to meet liabilities as they come due. There has been no change to the risk exposure from the prior year.

#### Market Risk

Market risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices. Market risk comprises three types of risk: currency risk, interest rate risk and other price risk. The organization is mainly exposed to other price risk.

### Other Price Risk

Other price risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices (other than those arising from interest rate risk or current risk), whether those changes are caused by factors specific to the individual financial instrument or its issuer, or factors affecting all similar financial instruments traded in the market. The company is exposed to other price risk through its investment. The company does not manage any exposure to other price risk. There has been no change to the risk exposure from the prior year.
